Richmond VA, June 17th, 2024 – The Branch is excited to announce their most ambitious exhibition and lecture series to date. The *Re-Think Design* series will re-introduce design to Richmond, a city teeming with creative design energy. Guest curator, Kelly O'Keefe describes design as "the discipline of aligning form and function — creativity and science, to improve our lives, our communities, and the world around us." O'Keefe goes on to state that "design fuses creativity with disciplines like engineering, construction, and manufacturing as it strives to transform the human experience. We design clothing and cars, posters and packaging, tools, and toys, furnishing and factories, hotels, and housing — even neighborhoods, cities, and ecosystems."

Starting in July and continuing through the year's end, The Branch will host monthly lectures and events that rethink the power of design across a range of disciplines from architecture and urban planning to fashion, industrial and graphic design.
